

### Success story in Nigeria

Indorama's investment in Nigeria marked a turning point in the country's Industrialisation drive. After successfully acquiring the former Eleme Petrochemicals Company Limited in 2006, the company moved to revamp and expand the hitherto ailing facility and positioned Nigeria for accelerated industrial growth. In addition to its world-class Petrochemical plants, the Indorama Industrial complex at Eleme in Rivers State, South-South Nigeria, currently hosts two state-of-the-art fertilizer plants with a combined capacity of 2.8 million metric tonnes annually. This figure is expected to increase by 2026 when the company intends to inaugurate its fertiliser line 3 facility that would take yearly production to 4.2 million metric tonnes.

# Indorama's CSR Framework: A Model for Effective Community Engagement

Persistent conflicts between multi-nationals and their host communities formed part of media reports that emerged in the recent past from Nigeria's Niger Delta Region which hosts over 98 percent of the country's rich oil and gas resources.

The crisis that brewed was largely rooted in the feelings of neglect and marginalisation by the host communities whose representatives repeatedly accused the companies operating in their environment of dishonoring agreements reached with them over issues bordering on development, welfare and social justice. The situation created tension, leading to a series of protests which oftentimes degenerated into violence and shutting down of oil facilities and installations in the region.

Perhaps after a critical review of developments which appear alien to its thriving corporate governance culture that has endured since 1975 throughout 177 sites across 39 countries of the world, Indorama, a leading Petro-chemicals and fertilizer manufacturing company, has since engaged in a manner that gives all

critical stakeholders a huge sense of belonging and ownership. This reflects in the company's unique business model that is anchored on a philosophy that promotes equity, prioritises people and communities and respects the principle of equity.

No wonder the company has succeeded in maintaining a peaceful and cordial working relationship with its key partners, particularly the host communities. Since 2007, barely a year after it came onboard after acquiring controlling shares at the former Eleme Petrochemicals Company Limited, hitherto operated by the Nigerian National Petroleum Corporation, NNPC, Indorama has ensured strict implementation of the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) it signed with its six host communities namely: Akpajo, Aledo, Agbonchua, Njuru, Okerewa and Elelenwo.

The MOU, which provides the framework for effective engagement with the host communities, is distinct in many ways. First, it incorporates the needs of the communities in project conceptualisation and implementation to ensure that what is delivered meets the expectations and yearnings of the people. Another interesting aspect is that, within the MOU framework, the Rivers State Government constituted a Project Advisory Committee (PAC) comprising representatives from the six host communities, the Rivers State Government and the Local government in Eleme.

With infrastructural Budgetary Support which increased to 720 million naira in 2025 from 180 million naira in 2007, Indorama's six host communities have continued to benefit from numerous people-

# Amit Lohia

## Building on a legacy of innovation and Entrepreneurial Spirit

Amit Lohia was born in 1974 in Indonesia, one year before the founding of Indorama Synthetics in Purwakarta, West Java by his grandfather Mohan Lal Lohia, and father, Sri Prakash Lohia. It was a single facility churning out spun yarns amid the rice paddies. It was humble beginnings. His grandfather's foresight and his father's determination laid the foundation on which the global conglomerate stands today.

Then, none of the protagonists would have thought that the little seed planted would grow into a \$22 billion enterprise employing over 51,000 people worldwide, 50 years later. Today, that little seed is the eighth-largest non-state sponsored fertiliser producer and a giant in polyolefins and textiles.

Amit Lohia, who has risen to the position of Vice Chairman, embodies the third generation of a dynasty built on polyester dreams. He is the strategic force who has woven the family's entrepreneurial DNA into a tapestry of international success, bridging the future with vision and audacious entrepreneurship.

From the humble fields of Indonesia

to a global powerhouse spanning 39 countries, producing everything from life-sustaining fertilisers to protective medical gloves, Indorama's story is one of audacious ambition and unyielding grit.

Amit joined the family business immediately after earning a Bachelor of Economics and Finance degree in 1995, as a 21-year-old from the Wharton School of Business at the University of Pennsylvania. He ascended swiftly to Director in 1996, Vice President Director in 2004, and President Director by 2009.

By 2013, he was Vice President Commissioner, a role reaffirmed in 2023, and today, he is the Group Vice Chairman of Indorama Corporation in Singapore. He

oversees a portfolio that includes subsidiaries in fertilisers, polymers, fibers, and yarns.

He didn't join the family business as an heir; he joined as a builder. "From day one, it was about execution," he said in an interview, adding "we didn't inherit success; we engineered it."

### **The Prince of Polyester: Turning challenges into empires**

While his grandfather Mohan Lal and father Sri Prakash Lohia were the visionary founders, Amit is the executor, the "Prince of Polyester" who has propelled the Group into uncharted territories.

Under his guidance, Indorama has mastered the art of the turnaround, transforming distressed assets into

profitable resources and greenfield dreams into reality.

For example, he spearheaded the 2006, \$225 million acquisition of Indorama Eleme Petrochemicals from the federal government of Nigeria.

He invested another \$200 million to resurrect what was widely seen as an ailing facility within six months, turning it into Sub-Saharan Africa's largest olefins manufacturer. But it was not all smooth sailing, as the company was confronted by an unprecedented perilous security challenge in 2007, when 12 executives, including key team members, were kidnapped and held in captivity for a month.

Amit joined his father's negotiation team and was part of the traumatic discussions that resulted in their

Phosphate production from under 100,000 metric tons to 350,000 annually, introducing crop-specific water-soluble fertilisers branded "Oltin" for Central Asian markets, which is reputed to be suitable for all types of soil and crops.

Closer to home, his oversight of PT Indo-Rama Synthetics Tbk, the Group's Indonesian flagship that went public on the Indorama Stock Exchange (IDX) on December 15, 1990, has sustained its role as a polyester fiber powerhouse.

And in Malaysia, Amit's team engaged Prime Minister Anwar Ibrahim in July 2025 to explore a \$1.4 billion fertilizer project, underscoring Indorama's commitment to strategic alliances.

Indorama's expansion under Amit has created jobs in the tens of

"We've grown by harnessing chemistry for good," Amit noted during the Global Retreat in Tuscany, Italy November 4 - 6, 2023, where 80 executives brainstormed under the theme "Co-creating the Future."

### **Growing from a Family business to a bigger family business**

For Amit Lohia, family remains his safe harbour. Married to Aarti Lohia, a philanthropist and art collector whose initiatives echo the Lohia ethos of giving back, Amit balances boardrooms with board games at home. His sister, Shruti, drives the medical gloves division while championing women's and child healthcare in India through partnerships like the Kinder Group.

Together, they honour the late Mohan Lal's wisdom: Divide to unite,

release. That ordeal would have made the fainthearted to pack up and run, but instead it forged an unbreakable resolve in him and today, the site boasts a \$1.2 billion fertilizer complex, funded in part by the World Bank's International Finance Corporation, with plans for another \$2 billion investment.

The Nigeria experience became a springboard. Amit's playbook of acquire, revitalise, and grow has been replicated across continents. In Senegal, he led the development of Indorama Chimiques du Senegal (ICS), boosting Africa's fertilizer self-sufficiency. In October 2025, Indorama deepened its roots in Senegal by penning an MoU with the government for a further investment of \$210 million.

According to reporting by Ecofin Agency, "these projects represent a major expansion of ICS's fertiliser production capacity. The increased output could allow Indorama to capture a larger share of Senegal's fertilizer market, which is expected to grow in the coming years."

In Uzbekistan, the 2019 acquisition of the Kokand facility under his guidance ramped up Single Super

thousands, from factory floors in Indonesia to boardrooms in Dubai. The Group's 177 manufacturing sites now feed global supply chains, ensuring affordable fertilisers for farmers in Africa and beyond, protective gears for healthcare workers worldwide, and sustainable textiles that trace back to those early yarns.

These feats aren't just financial; they're foundational. "Success isn't measured in balance sheets alone," Amit has said. "It's in the lives we touch, the farmer who harvests more, the nurse who stays safe."

### **A green horizon of sustainability**

As Indorama toasts its golden anniversary, Amit Lohia is scripting its next chapter with an eye on the planet's health. In a bold announcement this year, the Group unveiled its Decarbonization Plan: a \$130 million investment to slash greenhouse gas emissions by 20% by 2028. This is not rhetoric; it is legacy-building. The initiatives encompass renewable energy integration, energy efficiency upgrades, and waste-to-value innovations across sites from Nigeria to Thailand.

innovate to endure. The Lohia brothers - Sri Prakash in London, Aloke leading Indorama Ventures in Bangkok - form a triumvirate of complementary strengths, with Amit as the agile bridge to tomorrow via vision and audacious entrepreneurship.

In a recent interview Amit said, "my grandfather planted the seed, my father nurtured it through storms, now, it's our turn to ensure it shades generations."

### **Reflections at 50, looking ahead**

As toasts echoed from Jakarta to Port Harcourt, and fireworks lit up Singapore's skyline in celebrations of Indorama's 50th anniversary Amit reflected "this golden anniversary is not just looking back - it is about looking ahead to the next chapter of our journey."

In a goodwill message to staff of Indorama Corporation worldwide, in an interview with Indorama-Nigeria IMPACT Magazine, he said "I want to extend my deep gratitude to all our Employees. This incredible milestone is a testament to your hard work, dedication, and commitment to our organization."



## Tanzanian Envoy visits Indorama-Nigeria to explore Investment Opportunities

Indorama-Nigeria has continued to attract interest from African countries seeking to leverage its production expertise to drive development. The company's excellent manufacturing track record in Nigeria, where it has in the last 19 years transformed the country's industrial landscape with its world-class petrochemicals and fertiliser plants, has excited the government of Tanzania, an agrarian country that is also rich in natural gas. Tanzanian High Commissioner to Nigeria, His Excellency, Selestine Gervas Kakele visited Indorama-Nigeria's complex in Eleme, Rivers State on Thursday, 20th November 2025, to discuss potential partnerships.

The High Commissioner, who was accompanied by his economic attaché, Madam Clementine Vallery Msafiri, was warmly received by Indorama's management team comprising Messrs. A. B. In his welcome address, Mr. Rao highlighted the success story of Indorama in Nigeria since 2006 when the company took over the ownership and operation of the former petrochemical facility hitherto operated by the NNPC. He said the company revitalised the moribund plants for optimal performance and has since built and inaugurated two

world-class fertiliser plants with combined capacity of 2.8 million metric tonnes annually, which is expected to rise to 4.2 million metric tonnes by the first quarter of 2026 when the line 3 project is commissioned.

After the mandatory safety briefing, Mr. Rao guided the visitors on a bus ride to Indorama's petrochemical plant facilities: Health, Safety, Environment and Fire (HSEF); Central Engineering Workshop, Olefins, Polyethylene (PE), Polypropylene (PP), Bagging warehouses, and Power Plant Utilities and Offsites (PPUO). The visiting delegation was also conducted round the Fertiliser 1 and 2 plants as well as the train 3 facility under construction. They also

visited Indorama's state-of-the-art Soil Testing Laboratory, Fertiliser Laboratory and Product Display Centre where officials explained the importance of the facilities to Indorama's operations.

Upon return from the site visit, Mr. Kakele and his attaché listened to more presentations by Mr. Anand Gupta, Rahul Mohan and Akhil Rathore who detailed Indorama's growth story since 1975, Global footprints, manufacturing strength in Fertiliser and petrochemicals, growth trajectory in Nigeria and investment prospects in Tanzania.

In his remarks after what he considers brilliant presentations and an impressive tour of the company's facilities, the High Commissioner



thanked the management of Indorama-Nigeria for the hospitality, noting that the meeting signals a robust and mutually beneficial partnership between Indorama and the Government of Tanzania. The envoy who described Indorama's industrial facilities in Nigeria as massive, said he looked forward to the company replicating same gesture in Tanzania to drive industrial growth, boost food security and alleviate poverty in the East African Country. A visibly excited Kakele said "With what I have seen on ground today at Indorama, I am not just Tanzanian High Commissioner to Nigeria, I am now Indorama's Ambassador to Tanzania".

General Manager at Indorama-Nigeria, Mr. Kendrick Oluka, who is also the Head of Community and Government Relations Department, thanked the envoy for the visit and noted Indorama's legacy of excellence in project delivery as evidenced in the company's seamless operations in 177 sites across 39 countries of the world.

He appreciated Ambassador Kakele for his kind decision to assume the role of "Indorama Ambassador in Tanzania", assuring him that Indorama is poised to drive economic growth in Tanzania just as it is doing in Nigeria.

Mr. Rao and other principal officers of Indorama jointly presented corporate souvenir to the High Commissioner who also visited the OIS-Indorama Port Limited (OIPPL) and MM FZE, Indorama's new jetty under construction at Onne Port Complex in Rivers State.

"I look forward to the replication of these fertilizer facilities in Tanzania which would change the economy trajectory, lay lasting foundations for food sufficiency and guarantee long-term prosperity for the Government and people of Tanzania", Mr. Kakele said before his departure after a successful visit.

oriented projects ranging from construction of roads, electrification projects, provision of portable water, renovation of hospitals, building of schools to indigene entrepreneurship development, employment generation, scholarship for engineering students and health intervention projects. In addition, the host communities also benefit from Indorama's Micro Credit Grant for Women, Girl-child support, Merit Scholarship scheme for Undergraduate Students and Youth empowerment programmes.

Indorama's CSR initiatives are not limited to its six host communities as the company's pipeline and Port Terminal communities have equally

been carried along. There are 30 pipeline transit communities along the 83km Gas plant which stretches from OB/OB in Ogbia/Egbema/Ndoni Local Government Area in Rivers State to Indorama complex in Eleme. Beyond the budgetary support for infrastructure projects, bush cutting, surveillance and valve stations contracts which Indorama provides, the pipeline communities also benefit from other interventions such as scholarship awards, vocational training, skills development programs with starter packs for women etc.

Perhaps the icing on the cake is the 7.5 percent equity shares which the six host communities enjoy from the multi-billion-naira Indorama

investment, an arrangement that is widely considered unprecedented as the stake significantly exceeds the 3 percent prescribed in the Petroleum Industry Act, PIA. This translates into huge dividends accrued for the host communities and underscores Indorama's business approach as a great model for successful Public Private Partnership in Nigeria.

How Indorama has successfully operated since 2006 despite incorporating the interests of all key players, including the host communities, needs to be studied and emulated in our shared quest for a safe, secure and sustainable business operations in the Niger Delta region.

## Indorama's Rep attends 2025 Chemical Weapons Convention in Doha

The 12th Annual Meeting of Representatives of the Chemical Industry and National Authorities of States Parties to the Chemical Weapons Convention held in Doha, Qatar, from 21st- 23rd October, 2025.



Delegates from 25 countries, including Nigeria attended the high-level meeting called to among other things brainstorm on key performance indicators, challenges, and best practices in relation to the implementation of the Convention at the national, regional and global levels. It also seeks to raise awareness about relevant emerging technologies and their impact on Convention implementation by chemical industry stakeholders.

Charles Chima Wosu, a senior member of the Corporate Communications Department of Indorama-Nigeria, was among delegates from Nigeria that attended the meeting in Doha, following his nomination by the Technical Secretariate of the Organisation for the Prohibition of Chemical Weapons (OPCW).

The three-day meeting focused on understanding and addressing the challenges of small and medium-sized enterprises regarding regulatory compliance and risk management in connection with the Convention; leveraging the benefits and managing the risks of artificial intelligence (AI) to drive efficiency and innovation in the chemical

industry; and strengthening the contribution of the chemical industry to the enforcement of the Convention's transfer regime of scheduled chemicals.

Representatives from Chemical Weapons Convention (CWC) National Authorities and Chemical Industry had robust discussions on pertinent issues during key sessions presided over by His Excellency, Sheikh Saud bin Abdulrahman bin Hassan Al- Thani, Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of State Defence Affairs, State of Qatar.

High-points of the global forum included overview of Science and Policy-related developments, update on Article VI Verification Matters, updates from chemical industry and Trade organisations, highlights of OPCW's activities, Plenary Session, Break-out Group discussion and presentation of recommendations and the Draft Meeting Outcome Report.

The meeting reaffirmed National Authority and Chemical Industry both sides' commitment to strengthening Chemical Weapons Convention, laying the foundation for sustainable industrialisation and guarantee chemical safety.

Nigeria, India, China, United Kingdom, Italy, Germany, Netherlands, Malaysia, Kenya, Morocco, Nepal, Pakistan, Iran, Iraq, Brazil, Belgium and Vietnam were among the countries of the world that graced the event.

Brigadier (Engineer) Hassan Mohd Al-Emadi, Chairman National Committee for the Prohibition of Weapons (NCPW) State of Qatar presented certificates of participation to the delegates.
